# Important Medical Information If You Are Travelling

Welcome summer! Hopefully, you and your family members will be spending more time outside being active or even traveling. Whether biking, hiking or taking a road trip, do you know what to do if you experience a minor, non-emergency injury or illness this summer? With TRICARE, you have an expert to turn to if you need health care advice. Instead of waiting or worrying, use the <u>Military Health System</u> (<u>MHS</u>) <u>Nurse Advice Line</u> and get advice from a registered nurse anytime.

A registered nurse is available 24/7 to:

- Answer your health care questions
- Assess your symptoms and provide recommendations for the most appropriate level of care

- Provide evidence-based instructions to treat minor ailments at home

- Help locate an urgent care or emergency care facility

- Help you schedule an appointment within 24 hours at a <u>military hospital or clinic</u>, when recommended by the nurse, and if enrolled at a military hospital or clinic

To reach a nurse, visit the <u>MHS Nurse Advice Line website</u> to begin a secure web chat or video chat. You can also call and speak to a nurse. If you're in the U.S., Guam, or Puerto Rico, call 1-800-TRICARE (1-800-874-2273) and choose option 1. For all other country-specific phone numbers, visit the website.

The MHS Nurse Advice Line is only available to TRICARE beneficiaries living or traveling in the U.S. or a country with an established military hospital or clinic. There's no cost to you. If you're enrolled in the <u>US Family Health Plan</u>; however, there's a different resource for you to use for 24/7 assistance.

Remember, the MHS Nurse Advice Line isn't for emergencies that threaten life, limb, eyesight, or safety, or that require immediate medical assistance. If you reasonably think that you have an emergency, call 911 or your local emergency service center immediately, or go to the nearest emergency room or the hospital department that provides emergency services to patients who need immediate medical attention.

The next time you need help making decisions about your or your family's health care needs, don't guess. Contact the <u>MHS</u> <u>Nurse Advice Line</u> for 24/7 support and guidance for any

non-emergency situation.

# Agent Orange Bill Enrolled and Sent to President

NED Thomas Snee attended a bill enrolling ceremony for the Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act (H.R.299), hosted by the Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi. Enrollment occurs in the chamber where the measure originated and is carried out by enrolling clerks under the supervision of the Clerk of the House of Representatives and Secretary of the Senate. Enrolled bills are signed by the presiding officers of each chamber (or their designees) and are presented to the President by the House Clerk or Secretary of the Senate, depending on the chamber of origination. The President can either sign it into law or veto the bill.

As a result of the *Procopio v. Wilkie* decision, the House and Senate passed the FRA-supported Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act (H.R.299). This legislation will essentially codify the *Procopio* decision into law. The FRA is listed as a "friend of the court" by the petitioner Blue Water Navy Veteran, Mr. Procopio.

# **Acting SecDef Resigns**

Acting Secretary of Defense Patrick M. Shanahan, who was nominated by President Trump to be Secretary of Defense, abruptly resigned from the Department of Defense, citing an upcoming story in the news media about family domestic abuse.

Mark T. Esper, the secretary of the Army, is set to become the new acting Defense secretary next week. But he would be legally required to temporarily step aside if President Trump decides to nominate him to remain in the post.

# Happy Birthday Navy Corpsmen

A Navy Corpsman is an enlisted U.S. Navy medical specialist. Congress passed a bill authorizing the establishment of the U.S. Navy Hospital Corps, signed into law by President William McKinley on June 17, 1898. Corpsmen work in a wide variety of capacities and locations, including shore establishments such as naval hospitals and clinics, aboard ships and as the primary medical caregivers for sailors while underway. Navy Corpsmen are frequently the only medical caregiver available in many fleet or Marine units on extended deployment. In addition, corpsmen perform duties as assistants in the prevention and treatment of disease and injury and assist health care professionals in providing medical care to sailors and their families.

# President Trump Signs Agent Orange Bill into Law

President Donald Trump signed the Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act (H.R.299) into law. Last year, the House unanimously passed the bill only to have it stall in the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee. The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit in Washington D.C. ruled in favor of Agent Orange/Blue Water Navy veterans in Procopio v Wilkie court decision this past January. The Department of Justice declined to appeal the decision so the House and Senate passed the FRA-supported legislation unanimously. This court case argued on behalf of Blue Water Veterans saying that Navy veteran, Mr. Procopio, who never stepped foot on land in Vietnam, was exposed to Agent Orange during his military service off the coast of the Republic of Vietnam. Due to this exposure, he developed medical conditions consistent with other veterans who served on land and were exposed to Agent Orange and therefore be entitled to a presumptive category and be eligible for benefits. This legislation essentially codifies the Procopio decision into law. The FRA is listed as a Friend of the Court by the petitioner Blue Water Navy Veteran, Mr. Procopio.

# **Basic Information on Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS)**

Summer is when you and your family may fulfill new orders and move to a new duty station. If you move this summer, don't forget to update your information in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS). Being able to use TRICARE depends on keeping DEERS up to date.

DEERS is a database of active duty and retired service members, their family members, and others who are eligible for TRICARE. TRICARE eligibility shows up in DEERS based on the sponsor's status. Keeping your DEERS record up to date is key to you getting timely and effective TRICARE benefits.

In DEERS, make sure to check your address, duty status, phone numbers, and email addresses. This is especially true after a permanent change of station, or PCS move and anytime you experience a Qualifying Life Event (QLE). A QLE can include getting married or divorced, giving birth, or retiring. Also, check out what you need to do if you're moving. Remember, your Social Security number (SSN) and the SSN of each of your covered family members must be included in DEERS for your TRICARE coverage to be accurate.

Changing your contact information in DEERS is easy, and you have several options to do so. You can make changes online, by phone, fax, or mail, or in person at the nearest ID card office. Find an office near you using the RAPIDS Site Locator. To add or remove family members, you must visit a local ID card office.

June 26th 2019 Dear Commanders,

It December 1992 in Harrington, Maine, wreath maker Morrill Worcester found himself with a surplus of 5,000 wreaths during the holiday season. Worcester saw the surplus as an opportunity to pay tribute to our country's veterans. With the help of Maine Senator Olympia Snowe, they arranged for the wreaths to be placed at Arlington National Cemetery. This annual tribute to our country's veterans has continued ever since, touching the lives of millions of veterans' families and volunteers and growing in scope through the years.

In 2007, the Worcester family along with veterans and volunteers formed the non-profit organization Wreaths Across America to continue and expand their efforts at Arlington National Cemetery and to support those around the country who wished to do the same. Wreaths Across America's mission is simple: **Remember** the fallen, **Honor** those that serve, and **Teach** the next generation about the value of freedom. Morrill's wife, Karen, has served as the organization's volunteer Executive Director since the non-profit was created and today oversees what has become a massive volunteer organization that continues to grow. In 2018 alone, Wreaths Across America and its national network of volunteers place over 1.8 million veterans' wreaths at 1,600 locations in all 50 U.S. states, at sea, and abroad. The American Cemetery at Normandy was included for the first time in 2018.

This year, National Wreaths Across America day will be held on Saturday, December 14th 2019. Locally, a ceremony will begin at 0900 followed by the placement of wreaths at Miramar National Cemetery located at 5795 Nobel Dr where over 12,000 local veterans are laid to rest. This is open to anyone who would like to attend. In 2018 there were approximately 10,500 wreaths placed and this year there are approximately 2,500 additional veterans interred. This year our goal is to place a wreath on every headstone. With the 173D AIRBORNE BRIGADE ASSOCIA-TIONS generosity, we are hoping to meet this goal and ensure no veteran is forgotten.

On behalf of the volunteers and military families looking to honor all the veterans laid to rest at Miramar National Cemetery and the Wreaths Across America extended family, I thank you for your consideration of this patriotic cause. I'll be in touch to determine your interest in supporting the mission to Remember, Honor, Teach.

Once registered, a fundraising page will be created for you which you can then sign in to customize and manage for your group through www.wreathsacrossamerica.org.
